### Situation Report: "COVID-19" Preparedness and Response

As of 20th July 2020, the global death is 603691 (5111 new deaths) with 14348858 (229780 new cases) being infected and more than 70,00000 recovered from COVID-19 pandemic.

Ministry of Health and Population confirmed 150 new COVID-19 cases, with this the total number of confirmed case reached to 17994 and total death count has reached 40 as of 21st July 2020.

Ministry of Health and Population, Health Emergency Operation Centre (HEOC), is leading the responsewith the support of UN agencies and many other organizations. Nepal Red Cross Society (NRCS) is also the part of it, with the support of movement partners and government agencies at all levels NRCS is responding to the current situation. NRCS emergency operation Centre (EOC) was activated on 6<sup>th</sup> of February 2020 and 135 SITREPS released with the activities held in 77 District chapters of Red Cross. Nepal Red Cross Society (NRCS), supported by Red Cross and Red Crecent (RCRC) Movement and non-Movement partners bears unique responsibilities and added value

when it comes to responding to any emergencies. Meanwhile, NRCS is supporting the Government in COVID-19 response and preparedness through various sectoral activities being implemented through its local branches to meet the needs of community in this current pandemic

#### **Highlights:**

#### Planning Monitoring Evaluation Reporting-Information Management (PMER-IM) in COVID-19 Response

Nepal Red Cross Society in coordination with the International Federation of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC), Participating National Societies (PNSs) and International Committee of Red Cross (ICRC) has developed an approach paper which will guide the overall COVID-19 preparedness and response operation in Nepal. The approach paper has identified five key service areas: i) Health and Care, ii) Water, Sanitation and Hygiene Promotion (WASH), iii) Risk Communication and Community Engagement and Accountability (RC-CEA), iv) Protection, Gender and Inclusion (PGI) and v) Shelter. These five key services are complemented by the two enabling actions i) National Society Development (NSD) and Planning Monitoring Evaluation Reporting and Information Management (PMER-IM) and three support functions i) human resource and duty of care, ii) finance and risk management and iii) logistic and information technologies. Guided by the approach paper NRCS developed a domestic response plan in coordination with the IFRC, ICRC and PNSs. However, NRCS has been active since the first case was detected in Nepal. NRCS has continued the coordination with the Government line agencies, Ministries, and other stakeholders. The NRCS Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) has been activated since 6 February with volunteers and staff tracking actions taken by Province, District and Sub-Chapters on risk communication and institutional preparedness on a daily basis. As of 21 July 2020, a total of 135 Situation Reports were issued and shared widely with government authorities, district chapters, UN agencies, donors as well as Movement Partners.

PMER-IM as an enabling action for COVID-19 response and preparedness operation, NRCS PMER-IM division is working closely with the NRCS departments, IFRC, ICRC and PNS while fulfilling the PMER roles and responsibilities related to COVID-19. As part of that, NRCS conducted online district assessment and finalize the report. Took lead in finalizing the consolidated National Society Plan, log frame, M&E plan and programme logic which will be useful in monitoring of the operation in the later stages. Similarly, NRCS PMER-IM division is developing COVID-19 bi-weekly operation update. NRCS PMER-IM division is taking lead in updating the COVID-19 related field report in GO platform in close coordination with NRCS departments, IFRC and Am Cross. In addition, NRCS has developed the 5W data collection tool along with the guidance note. The PMER-IM team has received feedback from NRCS departments and management. The 5 W tool and guidance note has finalized both in Nepali and English language. NRCS PMER-IM division is taking lead in conducting the 5W orientation among districts through virtual means (e-learning). Till date, 77 districts have been oriented in the 5W data collection template. Data is generated and being shared with sector team. Similarly, a 5W dashboard is in process. The 5W table will be used as a main source of data for all for COVID-19 preparedness and response operation. In addition, PMER-IM division in coordination with other departments developed mini stories capturing the key success and other stories from various district with COVID-19 activities. Similarly, PMER-IM division is developed, different report tools and report are being produced in the different timeframe.
