Situation Report : COVID-19 Preparedness and Response

7/22/2020

As of 21st July 2020, the global death is 607781 (4083 new deaths) with 14562550 (213637 new cases) being infected and more than 70,00000 recovered from COVID-19 pandemic.

Ministry of Health and Population confirmed 100 new COVID-19 cases, with this the total number of confirmed cases has reached to 18094 and total death count has reached 42 as of 22nd July 2020. 41st and 42nd deaths of COVID-19 patients in Nepal: 60 years old male from Dhanusha whose treatment was going on in BP Koirala Swasthya Bigyan Pratisthan in ventilator. Another 49 years old female, Chinese citizen currently working in Pokhara.

The government of Nepal announced that the lockdown imposed to control the Covid-19 outbreak in the country is officially ended from 21st July midnight. As per the decision, the odd-even rationing on private vehicles has ended and government offices will operate normally ending two shifts. The suspension on domestic and international flights will end and long-route public transportation will reopen from August 17. Sports and other academic activities except regular physical classes will also reopen from August 17. Likewise, hotels and restaurants will be allowed to operate and trekking and travelling businesses will also resume from July 30. However, some restrictions will still prevail such as academic institutions, conferences, workshops, trainings, seminar, demonstration, gathering, cinema halls and dance bars, health clubs and swimming clubs, salons, beauty parlors, spas, libraries, zoos, and museums until the next notice.

Ministry of Health and Population, Health Emergency Operation Centre (HEOC), is leading the response with the support of UN agencies and many other organizations. Nepal Red Cross Society (NRCS) is also the part of it, with the support of movement partners and government agencies at all levels NRCS is responding to the current situation. NRCS emergency operation Centre (EOC) was activated on 6th of February 2020 and 136 SITREPS released with the activities held in 77 District chapters of Red Cross.
