### **Situation Report : COVID-19 Preparedness and Response**

As of 6th August 2020, the global death is 702642 (6488 new deaths) with 18614177 (259344 new cases) being infected and more than 90,00000 recovered from COVID-19 pandemic.

Ministry of Health and Population confirmed 464 new COVID-19 cases, with this the total number of confirmed case reached to 22214 and total death count has reached 70 as of 7th of August 2020.

Ministry of Health and Population, Health Emergency Operation Centre (HEOC), is leading the responsewith the support of UN agencies and many other organizations. Nepal Red Cross Society (NRCS) is also the part of it, with the support of movement partners and government agencies at all levels NRCS is responding to the current situation. NRCS emergency operation Centre (EOC) was activated on 6<sup>th</sup> of February 2020 and 150 SITREPS released with the activities held in 77 District chapters of Red Cross. The main aim of the service is to provide right information to the returnees, inform on the importance of self-care and keeping the confidence level during this pandemic as they are encountering various stigma related to COVID-19. People were really happy to be back home and very much thankful to Nepal Red Cross Society for Psychosocial First Aid session.
