## **Situation Report : COVID-19 Preparedness and Response**

As of 28th July 2020, the global death is 650805 (4153 new deaths) with 16341920 (226783 new cases) being infected and more than 90,00000 recovered from COVID-19 pandemic.

Ministry of Health and Population confirmed 210 new COVID-19 cases, with this the total number of confirmed case reached to 19273 and total death count has reached 49 as of 29th of July 2020.

Ministry of Health and Population, Health Emergency Operation Centre (HEOC), is leading the responsewith the support of UN agencies and many other organizations. Nepal Red Cross Society(NRCS) is also the part of it, with the support of movement partners and government agencies at all levels NRCS is responding to the current situation. NRCS emergency operation Centre (EOC) was activated on 6<sup>th</sup> of February 2020 and 142 SITREPS released with the activities held in 77 District chapters of Red Cross. Meanwhile, NRCS is supporting the Government in COVID-19 response and preparedness through various sectoral activities being implemented through its local branches to meet the needs of community in this current pandemic

### **Highlight:**

#### **Nepal Red Cross Society Blood Transfusion Service:**

Nepal Red Cross Society, Blood Transfusion Service Center celebrated its 54<sup>th</sup> year of establishment conducting various activities: Blood donation program, blood donor honor program and publishing annual report. The safety and all the precautions, to prevent the potential risk of spread of COVID-19 were focused during the various activities. On the occasion of establishment day, Director of Central Blood Transfusion Service Dr. Manita Rajkarnikar expressed her gratitude to all the blood donors and supporting organizations for helping in this difficult situation of COVID-19.

Nepal Red Cross Society has been operating the Blood Transfusion Service in 116 different places within 73 districts of Nepal through blood transfusion service centers and units. Red Cross is providing its service even in this unprecedented situation caused by COVID-19. During the blood donation program Social distance was maintained and various motivational programs were conducted to motivate the donors for blood donation during the current situation of COVID-19. There is a Central Blood Transfusion Service at Kathmandu, four regional blood transfusion service at Biratnagar, Pokhara, Nepalgunj and Chitwan, 22 services at district level, 47 district emergency blood transfusion service and 38 hospital blood transfusion service units.

As per the report published on the occasion of 54<sup>th</sup> anniversary, Blood Transfusion service has served with 321000 units of blood to the patients in a year. In fiscal year 2076/2077, 238,836 units of blood was collected and 321,776 units of blood and blood component were made available. Similarly, in the last fiscal year 2075/2076, a total of 271,922 units of blood was collected across Nepal.

As per the analysis of blood group collected across Nepal, the blood of positive group is 96.70% and the blood of negative group is 3.30%. On the positive side, Group A has the highest percentage of 28.12 % and AB group has the lowest at 11.67 %. Similarly, the rarest blood type is AB negative which is 0.47 % in Nepal. Moreover, the number of women donors has increased from 16.1% to 17% this time. However, this number still needs to increase.
