Situation Report : COVID-19 Preparedness and Response

As of 12th August 2020, the global death is 737417 (4835 new deaths) with 20162474 (214985 new cases) being infected and more than 1,00,00,000 recovered from COVID-19 pandemic.

Ministry of Health and Population confirmed 525 new COVID-19 cases, with this the total number of confirmed case has reached to 24957 and total death count has reached 95 as of 13th of August 2020.

Ministry of Health and Population, Health Emergency Operation Centre (HEOC), is leading the response with the support of UN agencies and many other organizations. Nepal Red Cross Society (NRCS) is also the part of it, with the support of movement partners and government agencies at all levels NRCS is responding to the current situation. NRCS emergency operation Centre (EOC) was activated on 6th of February 2020 and 155 SITREPS released with the activities held in 77 District chapters of Red Cross. Meanwhile, NRCS is supporting the Government in COVID-19 response and preparedness through various sectoral activities being implemented through its local branches to meet the needs of community in this current pandemic.

Highlight:

NRCS-UNICEF in support of vulnerable children in COVID-19 pandemic.

Bindu Kumari aged 9 and Sindhu Kumari aged 7 are vulnerable children who lost their parental care at very small age. After the death of their father, mother suffered with mental illness and went missing by leaving 2 children unaccompanied. Since then, they have been staying with their maternal grandparents, who does not have any source of income and are old enough to give proper care and attention to children. Children are not able to receive any supplement health care if they had to in this pandemic situation.

These children were identified by Unit Action Team during their field visit and reported to district chapter. Looking this, vulnerable situation of children, NRCS in coordination with UNICEF has supported total Nrs 5000 per child to ensure the appropriate care of children. Further monitoring of children will be continued by district chapter and shall be coordinated with child care center if required in future.

Grand Parents are really happy and has expressed their gratitude to NRCS. Grandmother says, "Now for 2, 3 months we can feed nutritious food to our grandchildren"

Note: Unit Action Team is a cluster of population comprising 20-30 households to be led by locally nominated, dependable Team Leader. Number of Units are defined by local government, which should be geographically accessible pocket of households. Since their major task is to support WDMC, they will be activated in all disasters beyond COVID-19. With the support of UNICEF, Nepal Red Cross Society is forming the Unit Action Team in 50 palikas of 28 districts. Mainly Unit Action team will support to keep the record of every people entering the community, recognize the threats of the community and to keep the community informed with life saving messages and to support people with appropriate referral services during COVID-19.
