As of 15th August 2020, the global death is 755786 (9985 new deaths) with 21026758 (294237 new cases) being infected and more than 1,10,00,000 recovered from COVID-19 pandemic.

Ministry of Health and Population confirmed 641 new COVID-19 cases, with this the total number of confirmed case has reached to 26660 and total death count has reached 104 as of 16th of August 2020.

Ministry of Health and Population, Health Emergency Operation Centre (HEOC), is leading the response with the support of UN agencies and many other organizations.Nepal Red Cross Society(NRCS) is also the part of it, with the support of movement partners and government agencies at all levels NRCS is responding to the current situation.NRCS emergency operation Centre (EOC) was activated on 6th of February 2020 and 157 SITREPS released with the activities held in 77 District chapters of Red Cross.Nepal Red Cross Society (NRCS), supported by Red Cross and Red Crecent (RCRC) Movement

and non-Movement partners bears unique responsibilities and added value when it comes to responding to any emergencies. Meanwhile, NRCS is supporting the Government in COVID-19 response and preparedness through various sectoral activities being implemented through its local branches to meet the needs of community in this current pandemic

Unit Action Team Response during COVID-19

Dhiran Khadka and Hari Chandra Khadka resident of Chayanath Rara Municipality, ward no. 3 Irma village, Mugu were able to ret urn their home town from India in between the lockdown period in Nepal. As soon as this news was received by Unit Action Team leader Ganesh Bahadur Khadka, along with his team reached their home. They informed the family members about the potential risk of COVID-19 and asked the returnee to stay in quarantine. But, they were not ready to stay separately from their family. After struggling a lot they were convinced to stay in a separate room at their own house. The next day, NRCS in coordination with District Police Office, they were shifted to the quarantine site established at School.

Ganesh says, "Initially, the community did not accept the role of Unit Action Team . But with this incidence, we have been able to gain the trust of the community .We will be working for minimizing the potential risk of COVID-19 and its spread in the community along with other disasters that might occur in coming future."

Note: Unit Action Team is a cluster of population comprising 20-30 households to be led by locally nominated, dependable Team Leader. Number of Units are defined by local government, which should be geographically accessible pocket of households. Since their major task is to support Ward Disaster WDMC, they will be activated in all disasters beyond COVID-19. With the support of UNICEF, Nepal Red Cross Society is forming the Unit Action Team in 50 palikas of 28 districts. Mainly Unit Action Team will support to keep the record of every people entering the community, recognize the threats of the community and to keep the community informed with life saving messages and to support people with appropriate referral services.
