






IFRC wide Dengue Response Map

Following a surge in Dengue cases mid-2023, Nepal Red Cross Society (NRCS) initiated a country-wide prevention campaign from June with the support from the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) through the activation of its "imminent" Disaster Relief Emergency Fund (DREF) which supports local early actions by National Societies. In addtion, the campaign was further supported as a coordinated operation by the following incountry members: British Red Cross, Canadian Red Cross, Danish Red Cross, Finnish Red Cross and Swiss Red Cross. As of 31 December 2023, 777,625 people were reached with prevention and response activities, including:

- Health and Hygiene Promotion
- Search and Destroy campaigns
- Cash for Health initiative
- Volunteer Mobilization
- Community engagement and Accountability


All activities were closely coordinated with local stakeholders as well as national health authorities, where NRCS fulfilled its auxiliary role to the Government in complementing existing efforts to reduce health risks. The campaign was conducted in the 26 most at risk districts (out of 77



districts in Nepal), spreading in six out of seven Provinces of Nepal. NRCS leveraged its wide-spread network of Chapters, Sub-Chapters and volunteers to ensure timely support to people in need. This photo book captures some of the highlights of the campaign. It is a legacy to the hard work and commitment of all volunteers and staff members involved in the campaign.

Cash for Health

Under the campaign, NRCS piloted a Cash for Health in three districts in coordination with local hospitals. Patients with specific socio-economic needs received a small cash support to ensure their basic needs while they are recovering from Dengue.
